SUBJECT: POLITICAL SIGNS IN ROAD RIGHT OF WAY POLICY

The Road Commission of Sanilac County has adopted the following policy pertaining to political signs placed in the road right of way.

It is the policy of the Road Commission of Sanilac County that political signs must be more than 20 feet from the edge of the roadway (white line) for paved highways. Also, signs may not be within clear vision areas at intersections or commercial driveways so they will not interfere with the sight distance of a driver. No signs may be placed within limited access right-of-way. It is the candidates' responsibility to obtain any necessary approval from the adjacent property owner prior to the posting of signs. All signs are to be removed within 10 days after the election. Signs must be more than 30 feet from the center of a local gravel roadway.
